





"WALK!"

At the Battle of Romani, 4th August, 1916, two sand-carts of the 2nd Light Horse Field Ambulance, in charge of a corporal, were sent to bring in some severely wounded men from an exposed part of the line.


On the return journey, an enemy battery suddenly opened fire upon them, whereupon the horses immediately tried to break into a gallop. The corporal, remembering the wounded, signalled "WALK," and galloping to the head of the party, assisted to steady the teams. The horses resumed the regulation pace, and the enemy gunners, apparently recognising their mission, turned their fire elsewhere.

The incident was observed and reported by the regiment from which the wounded had been taken, and the corporal and drivers were awarded the Military Medal for their gallant behaviour.




"CARE."


