The intention of the small group of artists who founded the Senefelder Club in 1909 was to restore the craft of lithography to its rightful place as a fine craft.

They named the club after Alois Senefelder who invented lithography in 1798, held exhibitions and made converts in the cause of the craft. The club can claim to-day that it has fulfilled its mission in Great Britain and has had a strong influence abroad. The craft is restored to aesthetic respectability. The present members of the club have passed from the defensive position of the founders who drew their work on stone and looked askance at transfer paper. To-day's members are raiding deep into enemy territory. They have boldly taken over many of the technical methods of commercial printers and they exploit the zinc plate with remarkable imagination. Their use of colour in modern British lithography has opened up a new world to the printmaker and to the print collector.
