Foreword

The sculptor and the artist have a place in architecture and their association with fine building stems from ancient times.

In the recent past it was thought that a modern building could be regarded as sufficient in itself if its form be suitably expressive of purpose and construction; if there be harmonious relationship of all its parts; if it be simple; if there be absence of meaningless ornament and if the use of texture and colour be honest and logical.

But it is now again appreciated that the cultural expression which is architecture gains aesthetic vitality as it finds room for the nuances of thought and imagining which flow from the sympathetic contribution of artists.

In the design for the library building, as a centennial year project, the aesthetic problem involved the unspoiled retention of a building which has graced Brisbane since 1879. This led to deliberate subordination of the new building in its juxtaposition with the old.

Nevertheless, by its very placement, the new library building is none-the-less dominant and its simple form called for humanising enrichment.


The designs shown in this Exhibition were received in response to a national competition from which emerged the premiated designs of Messrs. L. Edward and L. G. Shillam—for the wall decoration and the sculpture respectively.

The prize awards were made by a panel of assessors comprising Miss Vida Lahey, M.B.E., Professor R. P. Cummings and Messrs. R. Haines, G. K. D. Murphy and E. J. A. Weller.

In the selection of the successful designs the aim of the assessors was to ensure that the wall decoration and the sculpture would be essentially integral in the overall design of the building—the contributions of the artists were not to be regarded as things out of context.

It is confidently believed that these works will form an important contribution to the artistic and cultural heritage of Queensland and that they will happily merge with the architecture of a building dominant at the portal of a city.
