Foreword

We are perhaps inclined nowadays to overdo our uses of the word "unique". Yet I think that I may, with unarguable detachment, claim uniqueness for this exhibition of canvases

by contemporary Israeli artists.

It is the very first projection of modern Israel art in Australia. It is a representative assembly of works which express in line and colour the ideas, the urges and responses of the very youngest national school of painters in the world today. And it is a symbol and a symptom of that unprecedented event in history which is the attainment of its first decade of breathless and brilliant survival by the renascent Republic of Israel.

Possibly there is much in this collection that might be challenged as unduly abstract or unreal. With such critiques I here take no issue. But I can soberly aver that the environment and conditions, in which the imagination and originality of our artists have thus assumed outward form, are unmistakably real, dynamically alive and rewarding: an Israel of democracy and social progress, of economic stability, of security sturdily defended, and of an art and culture that thrive on hazards, that draw their inspiration from troubles, and their vision from a great, new, spiritual adventure.

To the Trustees and Directors of the National Galleries of Australia I record my most grateful thanks for the exceptional interest, understanding and encouragement, and for the invaluable co-operation and acceptance of administrative and other responsibilities, which have made this exhibition possible.

Alisa Dover was an infant in arms when she came to Israel. From her early years she showed inclination and talent for designs and colours, and these aptitudes were encouraged by her teachers at school. Circumstances, however, prevented her from the systematic study of art. Guided mainly by her own intuition and the observation of the work of contemporary artists in Tel Aviv and Jerusalem, she painted landscapes and still life in watercolours. For some time she was a student of Professor Azarni.

In October 1954 she came to Sydney accompanying her husband who had been appointed Israel Consul in Australia. Under the stimulus of her new environment, she started to paint more frequently and took up oils under the tuition of Peter A. Penov, a former student of the Petersburg Academy and a pupil of Chuchoyev in Paris.

Although she is an amateur and does not belong to any particular school, Alisa Dover's scenic studies are of the French impressionist type.

Twice went abroad for short periods for art study purposes.

Participates in the general and group exhibitions organised by the Israel Association of Artists and Sculptors, of which he is a member. One-man shows held at various times in the larger centres of Israel.

Received the normal education of a young Jewish boy in Russia in those times. As a youngster, did much in decorative painting, modelling and crafts, but without direction.

1921 After miraculously escaping slaughter during the Russian pogroms, immigrated to Israel with a group from the Hechalutz Movement. Settling in Haifa, he became a teacher in elementary and secondary schools. The sculptor Hermann Struck (deceased) was the first to give Shorr systematic training in painting.

1926 Participated for the first time in a group exhibition at the Tower of David in Jerusalem. Since then has been participating in group exhibitions in the country.

1931 Held first one-man show in Tel Aviv, opened by the then Mayor, M. Dizengoff. Since then has held a number of such shows, particularly in Tel Aviv.

1936–8 Paris, studying at the academies. Held two shows, Sold many works.

1939 and 1949 Received the Dizengoff Prize, Tel Aviv.

1939-53 Member of a Kibbutz (Givat Hashlosha), teaching art in the school.

Now lives in Petach Tikvah.

1925 Visited Israel, resulting in a series of lithographs, "Voyage in the Orient". Earlier produced a series of woodcuts, "Reminiscences of Pogroms".

1932 Received the Prize of the City of Dresden, which was the last prize awarded a Jew before Hitler came to power.

1933 Immigrated to Israel.

From 1935 on – Numerous exhibitions in the museums of Tel Aviv, Jerusalem and Haifa. Twice received the Dizengoff Prize of Tel Aviv.

1937 Published a series of lithographs dedicated to the noted Habima actress, Rovina. 1939–44 Founded and directed the Jerusalem School of Painting and Sculpture (no longer in existence).

1948 Participated in the defence of Jerusalem during the Israel War of Liberation.

His works are to be found in the major museums of Israel, as well as in Dresden, New York, Boston, Philadelphia, Baltimore, Missouri, San Francisco and others.

Left medical studies to attend art academies in Berlin, Frankfurt and Paris.

1928 Moved to France, where he worked and studied, coming under the influence of Derain.

1934 Visited New York where he was much impressed by modern murals in public buildings.

1936 Immigrated to Israel where he became a member of a Kibbutz until 1953, specializing in fruit trees. Continued with his painting and did several murals in Kibbutzim, public buildings and factories. (His murals in the Shemen factory administrative building, 1947, were the first real frescoes executed in Israel.) Taught young artists in the Kibbutz Movement. Worked at book lay-out and illustration.

1948 During War of Liberation served in camouflage unit and headed Graphic Section in the cultural services of the Army.

1954-5 Travelled and exhibited extensively in Europe and in South America where he did four large murals for various Jewish institutions.

1955 Returned to Israel. Art teacher.

Has exhibited widely in group and one-man shows, in Israel, Paris, London, Brazil, Argentine, Peru. Participated in Biennale of Venice (1948) and of Sao Paulo (1954).

Twice received the Dizengoff Prize, Tel Aviv (1946 and 1952).

Jacob STEINHARDT

1887 Born in Cherkow, Prussia. At fourteen painted his first oil. After high school in Berlin, studied at the Kunstgewerbemuseum, Berlin. Studied with Lovis Corinth in Berlin (1907) and with Matisse and Steinlen in Paris (1909).

1913 Co-founder of the "Patetiker" art group in Berlin. First exhibit. Two portfolios of etchings published by Neumann, others following.

1914–8 Military service during World War I. 1922–30 Worked in Switzerland, France and Denmark.

1933 Immigrated to Israel.

1950 Head of Graphic Department, Bezalel Art School, Jerusalem and head of the school in 1952.

Throughout the years has had one-man shows in Berlin, London, Paris, New York, Chicago, Washington, Boston, San Francisco, Atlanta, Amsterdam, Athens, Belgrade, Dusseldorf, and South Africa.

1955 First Prize in Graphics at Biennale, Sao Paulo.

1936 Upon returning to Israel, became an active member of the Association of Artists

and Sculptors, since then participating in the group exhibitions of the Association.

Twice received the Dizengoff Prize, Tel Aviv. 1941–6 While doing military service in the Jewish Unit of the British Army during World War II, three times awarded first prize and once second prize in exhibitions arranged for artists in the armed forces.

Today serves on the Central Committee of the Association of Artists and Sculptors.
