

Member of the Japan Print Society, Jiyu Bijutsu Kyokai and Shinju-kai. Has published an album from the Berggruen Gallery, Paris.

Born in 1891 in Hyogo. After graduating from Meiji University, studied oil-painting under Saburosuke Okada and Takeji Fujishima, and began woodcut and copperplate in about 1912. In 1918 went to Paris via U.S.A. In 1924 attracted notice of French artists with his revival

of *Manier noire* in a renewed technique. Has won prizes at various international exhibitions and held one-man shows in various countries. Published albums in Paris in 1937 and 1945.

Biennial in 1955 and Venice International Biennial in 1956. Travelling personal exhibition in U.S.A. in 1959-60. Many publications of albums and writings. The Japan Folk Art Museum owns his works from his earliest period.

AUSTRALIAN TOUR 1962/63

Since their introduction into Europe in the mid-nineteenth century, Japanese prints have become increasingly popular with artists, collectors and public alike. Most of these woodblock prints were made by artists of the Ukiyoé school and the names of the early masters, Moronobu and Harunobu, and later Utamaro, Hokusai, Hiroshige and Kuniyoshi are known and honoured everywhere.

During the last twenty years printmaking of all kinds has increased tremendously. Modern artists have daringly enlarged the technical resources of woodblock, lithography, zinc and copperplate engraving, etching, silkscreen and monotype prints and mixtures of them all in a dazzling display of colour and virtuosity up to now unequalled.

Good prints have a quality and fascination of their own, but they are not paintings, nor a method of reproducing paintings in quantity. One of their main attractions to the collector is that they should be moderately priced.

Unfortunately commercial usage of the word print for purely mechanical reproductions has confused the public in its recognition of fine original prints, created and carried out by the artist himself.

This exhibition has been arranged by the Yoseido Gallery of Tokyo. The Australian tour opens in Sydney at the Art Gallery of New South Wales, from there going on to the Western Australian Art Gallery, The National Gallery of South Australia, The National Gallery of Victoria, The Tasmanian Museum and Art Gallery, The Queensland Art Gallery, and finishing at the Newcastle City Art Gallery in March, 1963.
