## H. C. RICHARDS MEMORIAL PRIZE

This yearly prize commemorates the memory of Professor Henry Caselli Richards (1884-1947), one-time Chairman of Trustees of the Queensland Art Gallery. It was instituted by the Trustees in 1951 as a 100-guinea prize for landscape painting, the winning painting becoming the property of the Gallery. In 1957 the acquisitive clause was removed and the prize now is of 1,000 dollars for a painting of any subject in any medium, the Trustees retaining the first option of purchasing any work submitted, including the winning one.

Judge for 1968 Professor Bernard Smith Director, Power Institute of Fine Arts, University of Sydney.
